

**National Pollution Discharge Elimination System (NPDES) Permit Update**

The NPDES Permit process continues its course with the finalization of the Federal Permit expected to be released in the next several weeks. State permits are in various stages of preparation, based on delegated authority to administer these permits, with several states not yet having released draft permits to those that have draft permits available for public comment. The following use patterns are to be covered under the draft permit(s): Mosquito and Other Flying Insect Pest Control, Aquatic Weed and Algae Control, Aquatic Nuisance Animal Control, and Forest Canopy Pest Control. Some states are considering an additional use pattern that could be termed Research and Development.

Meanwhile, there are several bills that have been introduced in the US Senate and the House of Representatives whose aim is to repeal the NPDES requirement. In addition, USEPA’s Draft NPDES permit is undergoing a routine procedural review by the US Office of Management and Budget (OMB). Several Senators have called on the OMB to carry out “substantial” scrutiny of the draft permit.

This NPDES Permit process is the result of the Sixth Circuit Court of Appeals holding that Clean Water Act permits are required for all biological and pesticide applications and chemical pesticide applications that leave a residue in water when such applications are made in or over, including near, waters of the US.
